MINUTES FAIRFIELD CITY COUNCIL SPECIAL CALL MEETING THURSDAY, JANUARY 2, 2025

The Fairfield City Council held a Special Call meeting to approve the Jefferson County Sheriff's Contract, on Thursday, January 2, 2025 at 5:30 pm in the City Council Chambers of Fairfield City Hall.

President Carnes inquired if the court department had enough staff and Chief Hunter stated that his personnel was already on duty during court hours.

Councilor Norman asked if we could apply to receive our E-911 funds. Mayor Penny stated that a discussion had been had with the Sheriff Department and Donnie West regarding the 911 funds. He stated that we could do a resolution to get the funds as soon as the 911 system was up and running in our dispatch office.

Councilor Norman made a motion to approve the Jefferson County Sheriff's Contract. Councilor Parks seconded the motion. Motion passed. Roll Call:
